Findlay Street Between Race and Elm Closed Monday for Power Substation Delivery

CINCINNATI – Findlay Street between Race and Elm will be closed Monday, Dec. 15, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for the delivery and installation of a power substation for the Cincinnati Streetcar.

Race Street will remain open except during a brief period while the power substation is set in place in the Findlay Market parking lot at Findlay and Race.

Motorists traveling westbound on Findlay Street will be detoured south at Race Street to Green Street to north on Elm. Motorists traveling eastbound on Findlay Street will be detoured north on Elm Street, then east on McMicken and south on Race.

Detour signs will be posted and pedestrian access maintained.

This is the third of four substations to be delivered. The substations power the streetcar along its 3.6-mile route. The first is located at the streetcar's maintenance and operations facility on Henry Street in Over-the-Rhine. The other is at Court and Walnut. The last one to be delivered will be located on Pete Rose Way near Metro's transit center.

Other Streetcar Work: Photo Opportunity

The final rails completing the Over-the-Rhine portion of the streetcar's 3.6-mile loop will be welded together at 9:00 a.m. Monday, Dec. 15. on Race Street between Elder and Green streets. About The Cincinnati Streetcar

The Cincinnati Streetcar is a modern streetcar rail transit system intended to stimulate

development, expand transportation options, and enhance livability by connecting key communities in and around the center city. The system, which is scheduled to begin passenger service in September 2016, consists of a 3.6-mile loop extending from The Banks to Findlay Market through Downtown and Over-the-Rhine.

Construction for the Cincinnati Streetcar is being carefully coordinated by the City of Cincinnati with its contractor, utility companies, Metro, and other partners to minimize disruption to residents, businesses and workers along the route. This transportation system seeks to bring more residents and more jobs to Cincinnati, creating a broader tax base to fund city services.
